New Museum, Downtown Gainesville

The new Cade Museum for Creativity and Invention is scheduled to open on May 19, 2018 in Gainesville. It is named after Dr. Robert Cade, a kidney specialist who is world famous for inventing Gatorade. Dr. Cade was a longtime professor at Shands Hospital at UF. The museum will reflect Dr. Cade's outlandish spirit, zest for life



and new ideas and his constant, genuine interest in helping, motivating and encouraging people of all ages and experience.

This unique building was designed based on the Fibonacci ratio of 1 to 1.618, also known as the "golden mean." This ratio is widely seen in nature in the branching of trees, arrangement of leaves on a stem, the fruitlets of a pineapple, the flowering of an artichoke, an uncurling fern and the arrangement of a pine cone. Leonardo Da Vinci drew the Vitruvius Man to demonstrate the Golden Mean or Phi in the human body. On average the ratio of the extended arm to the width of the shoulders is 1.618. Vitruvius was a famous Roman architect who believed the golden mean of the human body should guide all architectural design. The human body alone has dozens of golden ratios.

I had an opportunity to visit the Cade Museum at a pre-opening event a few months ago and was blown away by the feel of the interior space. The museum is an interactive space for people to explore science and nature. All of the rooms are on the perimeter of a central core with magnificent views of the open atrium of the

building. Please do yourself a favor and go visit our new fabulous Cade Museum as soon as it opens to the public. - Jeffrey Meldon

- 1 Cup of self rising flour
- 1 Cup of white sugar
- 1 Cup of milk
- 2 16 oz cans of sliced peaches in heavy syrup
- 1/2 cup of butter



Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Melt butter in the 9"x13" baking pan.
- 3. Mix flour, sugar, and milk.
- 4. Pour the mixture in the pan over the melted butter.
- 5. Spread the peaches, including the syrup, evenly in the pan.
- 6. Bake at 350 degrees for 45-50 minutes until the crust turns golden brown,
- 7. Let cool for about 10 minutes before serving.

Protect Yourself from RFID Theft!

You may have asked yourself "What is this symbol that recently started showing up on my credit cards?" Well, RFID stands for Radio Frequency Identification and the acronym refers to small electronic devices that consist of a small chip and an antenna. RFID technology has been around for over 50 years but recently has become commonly inserted into credit and debit cards.



An RFID-enabled credit card can wirelessly transmit payment information to businesses which allow the user to pay for items without having to swipe his or her credit card. The advantages of RFID credit cards are that they can be faster, more convenient, and even more secure if they require a pin instead of a traditional signature.

One of the possible disadvantages of RFID cards are that there may exist devices that can wirelessly steal credit card data by simply getting close in distance to the credit card that is stored in your wallet or purse. These RFID readers or skimmers are usually fairly small and innocuous and can be possibly defeated by RFID "blocking" credit card sleeves. The sleeves work by blocking radio waves from getting near your ID and/or credit cards and sending information to the potential thief's RFID skimming device.
